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Welcome to Kindergarten Admissions!

If you live in New York City and your child is turning five years old in 2015, your child should begin kindergarten in September 2015. We are excited to welcome your child to our schools and are here to help you along the way.

New York City families can apply to kindergarten online, over-the-phone, or in person at a Family Welcome Center. This book is designed to help guide you through every step of Kindergarten Admissions. The Kindergarten Admissions Process

All New York City students turning five years old in 2015 should apply to kindergarten. This includes students with disabilities and English Language Learners.

There are four steps in the admissions process in the year leading up to kindergarten :

- 1. Explore Your Options and Make Your List of Schools**
- 2. Submit Your Application**
- 3. Receive a Placement Offer**
- 4. Pre-Register**

Here are a few important facts you should know before you start exploring your kindergarten options.

- Admission is not first-come, first-served. All applications received by the deadline will be treated the same.
- Most kindergarten students attend their zoned school. Your zoned school is determined by your home address. If you don't know which school is your zoned school, call 311 or visit: www.nyc.gov/schools/schoolsearch.
- Students are considered for placement at each school based on a priority order called Admissions Priorities. Review the Admissions Priorities in each section of this book, and the groups that were admitted to each school last year, to understand whether your child has a good chance of being admitted to particular schools.
- All five-year-olds are entitled to a kindergarten placement, so even if you miss the application deadline, your child will be able to enroll in kindergarten for the 2015-2016 school year.

1. Explore Your Options and Make Your List of Schools

We recommend you use this directory to find out more about the process and school options for your child, then visit schools of interest to learn more. To find open house and tour schedules, contact schools or visit www.nyc.gov/schools/kindergarten.

As you are preparing your application, make sure to rank programs in order of your preference. You are the only one who can decide what is best for your child and your family. You can list multiple schools on the application, including your zoned school, but only list schools where you would enroll your child if you receive an offer.

The list you submit on your application should be based on your preference. Rank the schools you prefer the most first, but also include other schools in case your child cannot be placed at your most preferred school(s). There is no right or wrong approach when ranking schools on your application. Your child's priority to a school is dependent on the school's Admissions Priorities.

For example, if you rank three schools ahead of your zoned school and you don't get an offer at any of those three schools, your child may still get an offer to his or her zoned school, because that's where your child has a high priority. Similarly, if you only rank three schools and do not list your zoned school, and you don't get an offer at any of those three schools, your child may still get an offer to his or her zoned school. For more details on Admissions Priorities, review pages 5-6.

2. Submit Your Application

From January 7, 2015 through February 13, 2015, you can apply to your zoned school and any other schools that you believe would be a good fit for your child. You can apply online by visiting www.nyc.gov/schools/kindergarten, in person at a Family Welcome Center, or over-the-phone by calling 718-935-2400. For a full description of the application methods, see pages 3-4.

3. Receive a Placement Offer

You will receive notification about your placement offer in early April.

You will automatically be placed on the waitlist for the schools you ranked higher than the school where your child received an offer. Schools will contact waitlisted families directly if they are able to offer them a seat; no additional action is required to remain on the waitlist.

4. Pre-Register

In order to accept your kindergarten offer, you must contact the school to make an appointment to pre-register starting in April. Pre-registering your child at the school where you received an offer does not prevent you from receiving an offer at a school where your child is waitlisted.

When pre-registering, **you must bring your child with you**, as well as:

- Proof of your child's age (child's birth certificate or passport)
- **Two** documents verifying proof of residence. Acceptable documents are listed below:
 - Utility bill (gas or electric) in the resident's name issued by National Grid, Con Edison, or the Long Island Power Authority; must be dated within the past 60 days
 - Original lease agreement, deed, or mortgage statement for the residence
 - Current property tax bill for the residence
 - Water bill for the residence, dated within the past 90 days
 - Official payroll documentation from an employer (example: payroll receipt); must be dated within the past 60 days
 - Document from a federal, state or local government agency (on letterhead) indicating the resident's name and address (example: document from the Internal Revenue Service, New York City Housing Authority, or the Administration for Children's Services); must be dated within the past 60 days

Waitlists

If you are not offered placement at the school you ranked highest on your application, you will automatically be placed on the waitlist for all schools you ranked higher than the school where your child got an offer. For example, if you received a placement offer for the school you listed third on your application, you will automatically be included on the waitlist for your first and second choice schools. Schools will contact waitlisted families directly if they are able to offer them a seat; no additional action is required of families at this point in the placement process.

The Kindergarten Application

You can apply for kindergarten from January 7, 2015 through February 13, 2015 in one of three ways: online, in person, or over-the-phone. Please do not submit your application by mail or to a school. No matter how you apply, make sure you get a receipt. If you do not receive a receipt, there may have been a problem with your application submission.

Application Methods

Apply Online

Visit www.nyc.gov/schools/kindergarten to create an account and submit your application. After you submit the application, a receipt will be emailed to you. We recommend that you apply online, so you can access your account and receipt at any time. You'll also receive notifications via email, which is faster than information sent by mail.

Please note: You must have an email address to apply online. If you do not have an email address and/or do not wish to provide an email address, please apply over-the-phone or in person.

If you do not have a computer at home and would like to apply online, you can use a computer at any New York City public library with a free library card. To sign up for a free library card, you need to provide proof of address. To find a library in your area, call 311.

The deadline to apply online is Friday, February 13, 2015 at 11:59 PM.

Apply Over-the-Phone

- Call between 8:00 AM and 6:00 PM, Monday through Friday.
- If you speak a language other than English, be sure to request an interpreter.
- You will receive your application receipt by mail.

The deadline to apply over the phone is Friday, February 13, 2015 at 6:00 PM.

Apply In Person

Visit the counselors at a Family Welcome Center (see below for locations)

- Counselors are available to help you complete your application.
- Offices are open from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM, Monday through Friday.
- You will receive your receipt from the counselor when you submit your application.

The deadline to apply in person at a Family Welcome Center is Friday, February 13, 2015 at 3:00 PM.

Required Information

Whether you are planning to submit your kindergarten application online, over the phone, or in person at a Family Welcome Center, make sure you have the following information with you when you apply:

1. Child's name
2. Child's OSIS (student ID number, if available)
3. Child's date of birth
4. Parent/guardian name
5. Child's address
6. Your telephone number
7. Your email address, if available
8. Sibling information,* if your child has a sibling attending one of the schools that you are going to list on your application:
 - Sibling's name
 - Sibling's date of birth
 - Sibling's current grade
 - Sibling's current school
 - Sibling's OSIS (student ID number)
9. Child's current pre-kindergarten program, if applicable
10. Child's native or dominant language, if applying for a dual language program
11. The programs you are applying to, in order of your preference

If you miss the application deadline, call 718-935-2009 for information about enrolling your child. All families seeking to enroll their children for kindergarten will receive a placement offer.

* A sibling is defined as a brother or sister – including half-brothers, half-sisters, stepbrothers, stepsisters, foster brothers, and foster sisters – of the applicant, who lives in the same household and will be enrolled in grades K-5 in September 2015 at that school. You must list the older sibling's information on the application for your child to be considered for sibling priority. All sibling information is verified by the school before offers are made.

Applying in Languages other than English

The kindergarten application is available, both online and in person, in the DOE's standard languages: Arabic, Bengali, Chinese, French, Haitian Creole, Korean, Russian, Spanish, and Urdu. Interpretation is available over-the-phone in over 200 languages. Call 718-935-2400 for assistance.

Kindergarten Admissions Priorities

Standard Admissions Priorities exist for zoned schools and non-zoned schools. While there are some schools with Admissions Priorities that are different, most zoned and non-zoned schools use the priorities described below.

Zoned Schools

Most students attend their zoned school for kindergarten. A zoned school admits students who are zoned to the school (those who live in a designated area surrounding the school). Most zoned schools can enroll all students residing in the zone, but there are some exceptions. Your zoned school is determined by your home address. If you don't know your zoned school, call 311 or visit the Department of Education "School Search" (www.nyc.gov/schools/schoolsearch) and enter your home address in the search bar. Students who live within a school's zone are prioritized for admission to that school. If the zoned school has room after all zoned students are enrolled, students in the priority groups listed below may be offered placement, starting with non-zoned siblings.

In general, students who reside in the school's district have a higher priority than students residing outside the district. New York City is divided into 32 Community School Districts (often referred to in this directory as "district"). Your district is determined by your child's home address. You can also find your district, by calling 311 or visiting the Department of Education School Search site: www.nyc.gov/schools/schoolsearch.

Standard Admissions Priorities for Zoned Schools

1. Students residing in the zone, who have a sibling at the school in grades K-5 in September 2015;*
2. Students residing in the zone, who do not have a sibling at the school.

If space allows, students residing outside the zone may also be admitted, in the following priority order:

3. Students residing in the district, who have a sibling at the school in grades K-5 in September 2015;*
4. Students residing outside the district, who have a sibling at the school in grades K-5 in September 2015;*
5. Students residing in the district, who currently attend the school's pre-kindergarten program;**
6. Students residing outside the district, who currently attend the school's pre-kindergarten program;**
7. Students who reside in the district, other than those in (3) and (5) above ;
8. Students who reside outside the district, other than those in (4) and (6) above .

* A sibling is defined as a brother or sister—including half-brothers, half-sisters, stepbrothers, stepsisters, foster brothers, foster sisters—of the applicant, who lives in the same household. Schools offer a priority to applicants with verified siblings in the school.

** Students who are currently enrolled in pre-k and want to apply to the same school for kindergarten will receive priority for admission in kindergarten, but only in the school they are now attending. This priority only applies to students who do not receive zoned and sibling priority. Not all schools have pre-k.

Non-Zoned Schools

Throughout New York City, there are schools without a zone that give priority to applicants based on sibling priority, district of residence, and in some cases, other criteria. While most non-zoned schools follow the standard Admissions Priorities below, you should review the school pages to learn about each school's Admissions Priorities.

In general, students who reside in the school's district have a higher priority than students residing outside the district. New York City is divided into 32 Community School Districts (often referred to in this directory as "district"). Your district is determined by your child's home address. You can also find your district, by calling 311 or visiting the Department of Education School Search site: www.nyc.gov/schools/schoolsearch.

Standard Admissions Priorities for Non-Zoned Schools

1. Students residing in the district whose verified siblings will be enrolled in grades K-5 in the school in September 2015;*
2. Students residing outside the district whose verified siblings will be enrolled in grades K-5 in the school in September 2015;*
3. Students residing in the district who are currently enrolled at the school for pre-k;**
4. Students residing outside the district who are currently enrolled at the school for pre-k;**
5. Students who reside in the district, other than those in (1) and (3) above;
6. Students who reside outside the district, other than those in (2) and (4) above.

* A sibling is defined as a brother or sister—including half-brothers, half-sisters, stepbrothers, stepsisters, foster brothers, foster sisters—of the applicant, who lives in the same household. Schools offer a priority to applicants with verified siblings in the school.

** Students who are currently enrolled in pre-k and want to apply to the same school for kindergarten will receive priority for admission in kindergarten, but only in the school they are now attending. This priority only applies to students who do not receive zoned and sibling priority. Not all schools have pre-k.

Choice Districts

There are three districts in New York City where there are no zoned schools. These districts are District 1 (Lower East Side - Manhattan), District 7 (South Bronx), and District 23 (Brownsville - Brooklyn), and they are called Choice Districts. If you live in one of these districts and would like to apply to kindergarten there, make sure you pick up a Choice District publication for that district. These publications can be found at your local Family Welcome Center (see page 3 and online at www.nyc.gov/schools/kindergarten). Families who do not live in these districts may apply to kindergarten there, but should review each school's Admissions Priorities as families who live in those districts receive higher priority for placement.

Meeting Your Child's Needs

There are many different types of programs and services provided in kindergarten to support your child's unique academic needs. Not all schools offer the services and programs listed below, so if you have questions about what programs are offered at a particular school, please contact each school for more information.

Gifted & Talented Programs

Gifted & Talented (G&T) programs are one way the New York City Department of Education supports the educational needs of students with unique academic ability. G&T programs aim to deliver accelerated, rigorous, and specialized instruction aligned to the Common Core Learning Standards. Children who are New York City residents in pre-kindergarten through 2nd grade are eligible to participate in G&T Admissions.

There is a separate application for Gifted & Talented programs. Families interested in applying for a kindergarten G&T program should have submitted their Request for Testing (RFT) form by November 7, 2014. Students who became New York City residents after the RFT deadline on November 7, 2014 may request summer testing. You can also request that your child be tested for first grade placement in early fall 2015.

If you have completed a RFT form and your child is taking the Gifted & Talented test, you will receive notification of eligibility in April. If your child meets the eligibility criteria, you will have the opportunity to apply to Gifted & Talented programs. Magnet Programs

A magnet school is a public school that offers a school-wide curriculum designed around a specific theme. While some schools have the word "magnet" in their school's name, only those schools that received Magnet Schools Assistance Program (M.S.A.P) funding will be designated as "magnet."

Programs for Students Learning English

The Department of Education provides a range of programs and supports to ensure that students who do not speak English as their native language develop the language skills necessary to excel in elementary school. These students are called English Language Learners (ELLs). New York City schools use three types of English language programs to support ELLs: English as a Second Language (ESL), Transitional Bilingual Education (TBE), and Dual Language (DL), detailed below.

1. **English as a Second Language (ESL):** Freestanding English as a Second Language (ESL) programs, offered in all New York City public elementary schools, are taught in English with strategic native language support. All public schools offer ESL classes; content courses incorporate ESL strategies to help students learn English and the subject matter.
2. **Transitional Bilingual Education (TBE):** Transitional Bilingual Education (TBE) programs are designed to support students as they *transition* from classes/subject matter taught in both English and the native language to classes taught primarily in English. Students also receive ESL in this program model. As the student develops English proficiency, instruction in English increases and native language instruction decreases.
3. **Dual Language (DL)*:** Dual Language (DL) programs provide instruction in two languages (half in English, half in the target language), with the aim of enabling all students to become bilingual. These programs support both ELL students in need of English language instruction and English-speaking students who are interested in learning a second language. Both ELL students and English-speaking students act as linguistic role models for each other, and through their interactions, language development in both languages is supported. ELLs in this program also receive ESL. If you are interested in a Dual Language program, you must list that program specifically on your kindergarten application.

*Most Dual Language programs aim for a specific ratio of ELLs to native English speakers, so language may be used to prioritize applicants. Additionally, schools may conduct assessments to determine a child's native language.

Identifying English Language Learners

As the parents or guardians of a newly enrolled student, you are required to complete a Home Language Identification Survey (HLIS) at the school within ten days of your child's first day of attendance at school. This survey lets school staff know what language you use in your home. If the HLIS indicates that your child uses a language other than English, he or she is given an English proficiency test called the New York State Identification Test for English Language Learners (NYSITELL). Performance on this test determines whether your child is entitled to ELL supports and services.

ELL Program Orientation

If your child has been identified as an ELL, you should be invited to attend an ELL parent orientation at your child's school within ten days of his or her first day of attendance at school. During the orientation, fill out the Parent Survey and Program Selection Form and select the program that you believe best meets your child's needs. If you do not receive this form, you can request it from the school. The school pages in this directory list the ELL programs currently offered for kindergarten students in each school according to school-reported data. For the most up-to-date information about ELL program offerings, contact schools directly.

You have the right to request a specific type of program at your school. All schools offer ESL programs, and all schools are expected to open a TBE or Dual Language program when the families of at least 15 ELLs in a single language in one grade or two consecutive grades have requested that program. By selecting a TBE or Dual Language program on the Parent Survey and Program Selection Form, families help inform which ELL programs should be offered at schools.

Students with Disabilities Transitioning to Kindergarten

The Department of Education's special education reform, also known as *A Shared Path to Success*, is making significant improvements in the way services are delivered to students with disabilities, including increased access to the general education curriculum. All students entering kindergarten, including students with disabilities, should apply through Kindergarten Admissions as described on pages 1-4.

Reevaluation

Before starting kindergarten, preschool students who receive or are eligible to receive special education services will be reevaluated to determine what services, if any, they will need in kindergarten. Families will receive information about the process by mail in the fall and will be contacted in the winter or spring to participate in the reevaluation. If a child is determined to be eligible, the special education services to be provided in kindergarten will be listed in a document known as an Individualized Education Program (IEP).

Services and Supports at Schools

All schools are able to provide IEP services to the majority of students in their community. Families are encouraged to apply to their zoned school and other schools of interest.

Specialized Programs

While most students are served in their local schools, some students may be best served in specialized programs. The Department of Education provides specialized programs in some community schools. These include bilingual special education and programs for some students with autism or intellectual disability. For more information about specialized programs in community schools, email specializedprograms@schools.nyc.gov or visit www.nyc.gov/schools/Academics/SpecialEducation/enrolling/specializedprograms. The Department's District 75 provides highly specialized instruction in programs for students with significant challenges, including students with autism, significant cognitive delays, emotional disturbance, sensory impairments, and/or multiple disabilities. Notification about Placement and Services

Families who apply to kindergarten will receive a placement offer through Kindergarten Admissions in early April. In addition to the Kindergarten Admissions placement offer, families of preschool students with disabilities will also receive a letter in the spring or summer listing the school where any recommended special education services will be provided. Most students will be served at their local schools or the schools where they were admitted through Kindergarten Admissions. If a child has received an IEP recommending a District 75 program, he or she will be offered a placement in that program. If a child has been determined to be eligible for a specialized program, he or she may be offered a placement in a school with that program as an alternative to the placement offered through Kindergarten Admissions.

To Request an Evaluation

If you suspect your child may have a disability and need special education services, you may contact your local Committee on Special Education (CSE) to request an evaluation. For contact information, call 311 or visit www.nyc.gov/schools/Academics/SpecialEducation/ContactsResources/cse.htm.

Site Accessibility

All schools that are considered Functionally Accessible are indicated with the accessibility icon next to the school name and number.

Functionally Accessible Schools or Programs are located in a fully or partially accessible building where an individual with mobility impairment may enter and access all relevant programs and services, including the science laboratory, library, cafeteria, and the gymnasium; in some cases school programs may need to be re-located to accommodate access. At least one restroom is accessible.

Charter Schools

Charter schools are public schools – they are free and open to all students. They operate independently according to the terms of a performance contract, or “charter,” that can last up to five years.

Charter schools generally accept applications for the following school year until April 1 at the earliest, and most schools conduct admissions lotteries during the month of April. You should contact each school individually to obtain an application. 
