



*Nearly 400,000 more constituents responded this year than in 2007 when the Survey was first administered*




# Parent survey participation remained high across boroughs

# Parent, student, and teacher satisfaction remained high across categories




# Parents continue to indicate high levels of satisfaction with schools


My child's school keeps me informed about my child's academic progress.

I am satisfied with the response I get when I contact my child's school.


I am satisfied with the education my child has received this year.



# Newer survey questions ask parents to evaluate additional aspects of the school's learning environment




# Top parent requests for school improvements





# Students expressed high levels of satisfaction in key areas


I need to work hard to get good grades.




My school offers a wide enough variety of programs, classes and activities to keep me interested in school.

I am safe in the hallways, bathrooms, and locker rooms at my school.




# Students were asked new questions about academic and personal behaviors

At my school, I can become a better student if I work hard.




# Teachers continue to report high levels of satisfaction with the learning environment in their schools

My school sets appropriately high expectations for student work in their classes.\*


Order and discipline are maintained at my school.





# Teachers report that schools continue to support parents and teachers with shifting practice and understanding to align with the Common Core Learning Standards




# Teachers are increasingly satisfied with the quality of their professional development experiences

This school year, I have received feedback on my practice that helped me to improve my instructional performance.


Professional development experiences this school year have been sustained and coherently focused, rather than short-term and unrelated.

# Most students report that their classroom activities in ELA align with the Common Core Standards


During this school year, how often have your teachers asked you to...

During this school year, how often have your teachers asked you to...








Most of the teaching staff at my school make me excited about learning

Most students in my school treat each other with respect.



### Satisfaction with the Schools Chancellor




### Satisfaction with the Panel for Education Policy




